The program was a musical show where children sang 10 songs to evoke the story and entertain the audience.






Value based morning conversation



An exciting activity was planned for children as they had a safari ride, set up by teachers. They explored the animals around with their hand made binoculars and safari caps.








Making of a rain stick




1)Circle time and the feelings chart were utilized to enhance students' social-motional and communication skills

3)Reflection chart








Students were made to reflect on their strength and areas for improvement. This was done monthly.





Activities like Sorting objects, skip counting games, measuring activities, and board game helped students develop problem-solving skills, understand patterns, and make sense of numbers in everyday life.








2) Kindness chart






3) Creativity

Students are tasked with creating a piece of art or writing a story They are encouraged to think outside the box, experiment with different ideas, and come up with original and imaginative solutions.






B) Communication and Collaboration

Tamil Nadu: Presented Idli, Sambar, and Dosa.



On the morning of November 5, 2024, a subject enrichment session on the interrelation between electricity and magnetism was conducted. The session opened with an introduction to the guest lecturer, Mr. Sunil Paul, co-founder and CEO of Srishti Robotics, who skillfully explained foundational concepts in electromagnetism and shared effective strategies to help





The session's hands-on demonstrations were particularly engaging. For instance, an experiment involving a wheel and motor vividly illustrated how the wheel's rotation around copper coils generates electromagnetic flux. In simple terms, as the wheel spins, the motor acts as a generator, lighting up an LED. This interactive approach captivated the students' attention, encouraging

Mr. Paul presented key concepts in an accessible manner, ideal for revision purposes. Rather than focusing on complex details, emphasized essential ideas through relatable examples. For instance, he discussed hydroelectric power generation, explaining how an increase in height results in a greater potential difference, thus producing more







An essential part of the session was dedicated to exam strategies. Mr. Paul advised using larger handwriting, answering each question on a new sheet of paper, and making an attempt to answer every question. He stressed that our aim should be to make a positive impression on the teacher during the brief time spent grading the paper

Electricity and Magnetism

The session concluded with lasting advice: to savor the journey along the way.



While some students may have hoped for a deeper dive into the intricacies of electromagnetism, Mr. Paul's focus on exam preparation offered valuable insights, helping to build students' learn from our mistakes, to create plans even confidence in approaching physics exams. His friendly demeanor when things don't go as expected, and to and willingness to provide study advice created a supportive atmosphere. Future sessions could combine detailed content with more complex applications or student-led experiments. balancing exam tips with an in-depth understanding of the

Confidence & Team building

Confidence is crucial for any performer, which is why it's essential to start classes with exercises that foster this quality. As students gain confidence, they naturally become more engaged in class activities. Since theatre is an ensemble art form, it's equally important for students to develop strong teamwork and communication skills. These skills not only enhance their theatrical abilities but also serve them well in all aspects of life.



Confidence & Team building

Students improve their communication skills by interacting with the same group repeatedly during exercises. This familiarity helps them build stronger connections and trust. Later, when the groups are shuffled, students have the opportunity to experiment with new communication strategies, adapting to different dynamics and learning to collaborate effectively with a fresh set of peers.



Awareness & Spontaenity

Students are encouraged to be aware of their surroundings at all times, as awareness is essential for most theatre activities. To foster this skill, games that promote heightened awareness and spontaneity are often incorporated into lessons. These games help students develop important skills, including quick decision-making and adaptability, in a natural and enjoyable way, turning awareness into a subconscious habit. By participating in these activities, students not only improve focus, observation, and decision-making but also learn to respond spontaneously to changing situations. Ultimately, games create an engaging environment where learning and skill development happen effortlessly.



Improvisation

Students are intoduced simple improvisation exercises, starting with just gestures. They then progress to full-body movements without speech, focusing on physical expression. As they gain confidence, we gradually incorporate both body and voice. This step-by-step approach allows students to comfortably explore improvisation, building skills one element at a time before combining them into spontaneous performances.



Acting Exercises


Students participate in a range of acting exercises designed to build essential performance skills. Through exercises focused on reading micro-expressions, students sharpen their ability to observe and interpret subtle facial cues. They watch the other students carefully to read their expressions. This helps them in understanding how communication can work through micro-expressions. This is a technique that helps in developing subtleness when acting.



Acting Exercises


In exercises aimed at understanding their co-actor, students learn the importance of listening and responding to their partner's choices, fostering collaboration and a deeper sense of trust.

Students have been introduced to comedy, one of the most difficult genre to act. Such exercises allow students to explore comedic timing, physicality, and delivery, developing their ability to perform humor with precision. These exercises work together to improve emotional awareness, adaptability, and versatility in performance, preparing students for a wide range of acting styles.



Structure of a script

Students read a short play and engaged in a detailed discussion about its structure. To start, they were introduced to Freytag's Pyramid, exploring how its stages apply to the unfolding of the story. The class also examined the key elements of the play, including the development of characters, the progression of the plot, and the significance of the setting. This comprehensive analysis helped students gain a deeper understanding of how each component works together to shape the narrative and enhance the overall impact of the play.



Structure of a script


Based on their understanding of a script's structure, students write scripts of their own. They were asked to choose a topic from their own life as to ease them into the process of script writing.



When students write scripts based on incidents from their own lives and take on the role of director, they step into a new realm of storytelling—one that requires them to guide actors, shape scenes, and bring their vision to life.



One of the most valuable lessons in directing is leadership. Student directors must balance authority with teamwork, ensuring that their ideas are realized while also encouraging actors to bring their own creativity to the performance. They must learn to give constructive feedback, problem-solve when challenges arise, and adapt their vision based on the dynamics of the actors and the scene.



Beyond guiding performances, directing requires an awareness of stage movement, visual composition, and pacing. Students experiment with blocking—deciding where actors stand and move—to create engaging and meaningful stage pictures.



By directing, students gain a deeper appreciation for all aspects of theatre. They see firsthand how choices in acting, staging, and delivery influence the audience's experience. This experience fosters empathy, as they recognize the challenges actors face and the importance of clear communication in achieving a cohesive performance



Learning direction in a theatre class empowers students to take ownership of their stories and develop skills in leadership, creativity, and teamwork. It transforms them from performers into storytellers with a vision, preparing them not only for the stage but for any collaborative and creative endeavor they pursue in the future.



Students were taken to observe the rehearsal of Talent Fiesta to gain insight into the rehearsal and direction process. They watched how actors refined their performances, directors provided feedback, and scenes were adjusted for better execution. They noted how repeated practice helped improve delivery, coordination, and confidence on stage. After the observation, students documented their insights in a report, reflecting on how the rehearsal process shapes a performance and the role of direction in bringing a production to life.
